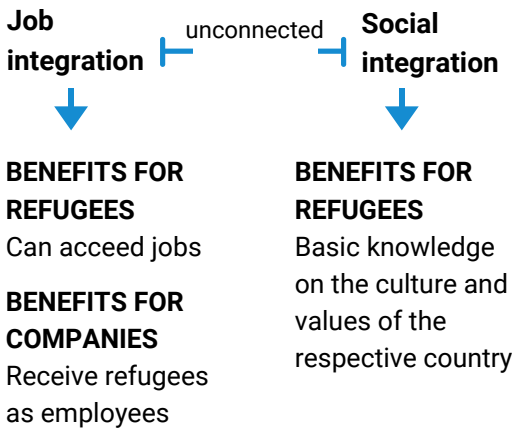

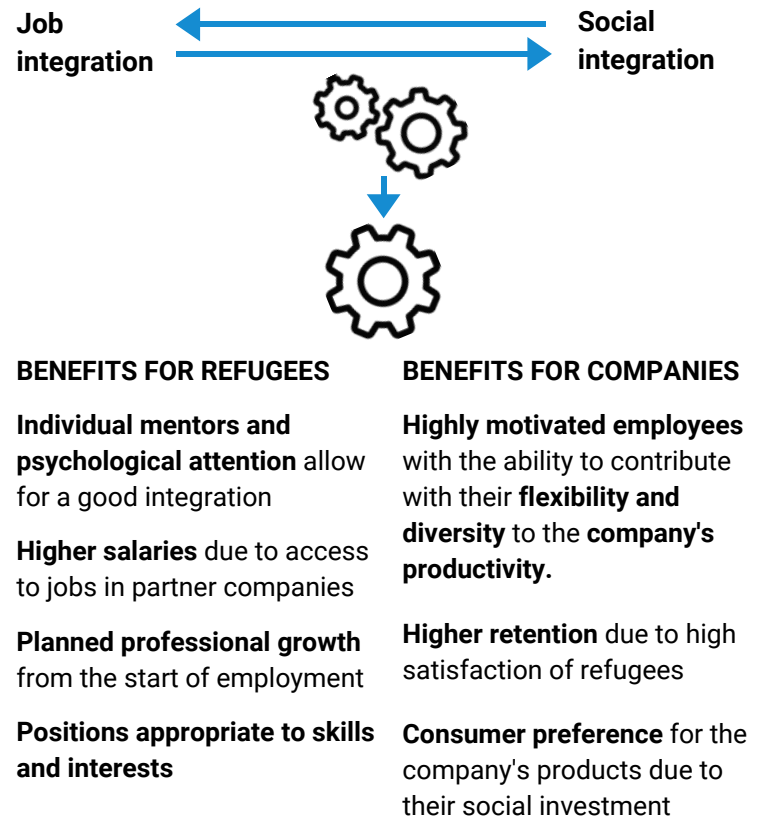
OUR MODEL: INTEGRATION DESIGNED FOR OUR REFUGEES AND PARTNER COMPANIES

Standard integration models



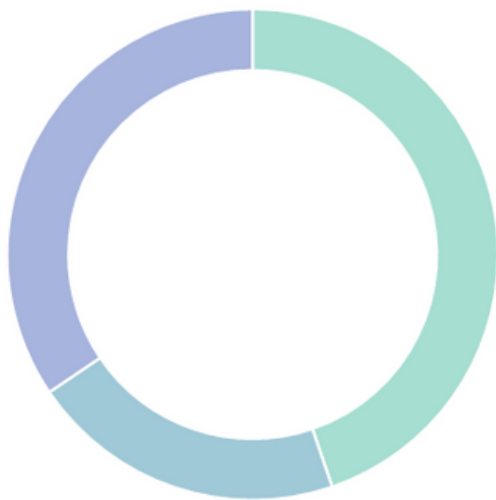
The **dual** integration model of INTRARE

The connection between our social and job integration allows them to reinforce each other. In this way we maximize the efficiency of our integration.



HOW WE USE YOUR SUPPORT

With your contribution we are maximizing the positive potential of refugees' integration for them, society and businesses.



■ 45% Basic needs*

Support for communication, transportation, food and clothing, according to the needs of each refugee.

■ 21 % Social integration*

Psychological care, individual mentors, and social inclusion events for refugees and Mexicans.

■ 34% Job integration*

Professional planning, jobs with partner companies, and support of integration in the new position.

** Note that the proportions of expenditures are different from those planned under a regular operating budget. This is because at this time certain anticipated expenses such as personnel are not being incurred due to lack of funding.*
